Libby's Childcare Program Experience

Lisa Louis is a single mother raising her 2-year old daughter, Libby. The Louis family is new to Bloomington, having recently moved from Indianapolis to be closer to extended family. Their relatives were willing to care for Libby while her mother worked, but Lisa recognized that an irregular schedule and being cared for by different relatives would be difficult on her daughter. She said, "Libby needed the security of a regular schedule, and I needed to know that care would always be available so I could work full-time without concerns."



When Lisa began to investigate her options, she repeatedly read good things about Monroe County United Ministries. Lisa commented, "when I visited MCUM's childcare center, I immediately felt at ease."

Libby was enrolled on MCUM's sliding fee scale, which meant less than 10% of Lisa's income would be spent on childcare. MCUM's sliding fee scale has made it possible for this one-income family to afford a licensed, accredited, high-quality care center that would otherwise be beyond their financial reach.

Conveniently located on the near west side of Bloomington, MCUM provides a safe place for shy Libby to feel comfortable socializing, learning, and having fun. The Louis family benefits from their new regular schedule in several ways. Everyday Libby enters the same classroom with the same teacher

and classmates, helping her slowly come out of her shell. She is in a structured learning environment with trained teachers, rather than being cared for by a babysitter or relative. Lisa is able to go to work each morning, satisfied knowing Libby will spend her day in a safe place learning and playing.

"MCUM has given a much needed sense of stability to a family that has experienced many changes and challenges in recent years," Lisa said.

If you missed our Spring Luncheon, you may not have heard our big announcement: MCUM will be opening an additional childcare site and renaming our childcare program **Compass Early Learning Center**.

We receive calls every day from parents wanting their children to be a part of our nationally-accredited program. This program is popular because of our sliding fee scale and high quality, making it affordable for all in need of a safe, educational place for their children. Our board members determined expanding our childcare program to additional locations will help us achieve our mission to create lasting solutions to educational injustice in our community.

The Compass Early Learning Center will now have two locations: Compass North and Compass Downtown. Compass North is our original location (827 W. 14th Court Bloomington, IN) and Compass Downtown will be located at First United Methodist Church (219 E. 4th St. Bloomington, IN). Compass Downtown will be a satellite of Compass North and will be mirroring our already highly-acclaimed program by maintaining the same standards and accreditation. We hope Compass Downtown will make it easier to for more Bloomington families to reach the childcare they need. Upon opening, Compass Downtown will accommodate 60 children; we hope to expand that number in the coming months. Compass Downtown will open in August 2017, and we are now taking applications.
