

Last year, with the help of the community, we raised over **17,000 pounds and \$3,000** for our programs between the Each One, Feed One, and Each One, Feed Two Food Drives. We hope to have an even greater turnout this year.

Pre-pandemic, we distributed more than **7,000 pounds** of non-perishable items to individuals and families in Monroe County each month. As the pandemic continues, we expect the need for our services to continue to increase.

"Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much." - Helen Keller Compass Early Learning Center is in the process of earning reaccreditation from the <u>National Association for</u> <u>the Education of Young Children (NAEYC)</u>. The process can take around two years for some institutions and much of the first year is spent preparing for NAEYC's final evaluation. Compass teachers are training hard and preparing classroom portfolios for what MCUM hopes will be a successful reaccreditation in Fall 2022.

NAEYC, a nonprofit representing early childhood educators, has 10 standards by which childcare centers are evaluated for accreditation. Compass is carefully preparing to meet these criteria as they prepare for final evaluations.

When asked about progress in meeting NAEYC standards, Compass Curriculum Director Stacy Jones said, "We have an amazing team of teachers and staff in general that are hitting all of our markers. We want to assure parents that we are providing the highest quality of care for their children possible. That is our ultimate goal." Jones went on to describe Compass' reaccreditation outlook as "very positive."

Achieving reaccreditation will not only bring a nationally recognized seal of quality to Compass services but will also allow Compass to qualify as a Level 4 childcare provider under Indiana's Paths to Quality Child Care Rating and Improvement System, the highest level achievable. Other than national accreditation, Compass already meets every requirement for Indiana's fourth level of Paths to Quality.


